(2) Achievements and Reflection on Major Concerns; Feedback and Follow-up

 Major Concern 1: To extend students' learning outside classroom so as to help them develop a broader outlook in life

Achievements

Throughout the 2023-24 school year, significant progress was made in enhancing the scope and quality of learning experiences outside the classroom, directly supporting the school's mission to foster comprehensive educational development. Notable achievements include:

- Increased Opportunities: The school significantly expanded its extracurricular activities, external collaborations, and participation in territory-wide competitions, surpassing reference data as noted in the Key Performance Measures (KPM). This enhancement provided students with diverse learning environments and experiences that contributed positively to their educational development. Students engaged in a wide array of activities, from local museum visits enriching their cultural exposure to participating in science fairs where they applied theoretical knowledge practically.
- Enhanced Engagement: The Stakeholder Survey reflected a high engagement level, with 85% of stakeholders, including students and parents, expressing satisfaction with the management and variety of extracurricular activities. This strong approval rating underscores the effectiveness of the school's efforts to provide diverse and well-managed extracurricular options.
- Positive Student Outcomes: APASO results showed that students experienced enhanced emotional and social benefits from these activities. Notably, 74.8% of students reported positive emotions, and students' sense of belonging and school spirit was notably high.

These metrics not only underscore the successful implementation of the planned activities but also highlight the tangible benefits these experiences have brought to the student body, contributing to a well-rounded education.

Reflection

Facilitating Factors:

- Effective Strategic Planning: The Academic Section's strategic planning was crucial in identifying and integrating meaningful learning opportunities into the school curriculum. This proactive approach facilitated a seamless blend of classroom learning with external educational experiences.
- Robust Community and Industry Partnerships: Strong partnerships with local organizations, cultural institutions, and educational entities were instrumental in providing diverse and practical learning experiences. These relationships enabled the school to offer a broader spectrum of activities that were both educational and engaging.

Hindering Factors:

- **Resource Limitations:** Despite the successful expansion of activities, resource limitations, particularly in terms of funding and staff availability, posed challenges in scaling up efforts to reach every student consistently.
- ◆ Varied Student Interests: Engagement levels showed variability, with certain activities drawing much more interest than others. This disparity suggests a need for a more tailored approach to programme development that considers the diverse interests and needs of the student population.

Consolidated Experience and Reflection: The year's experiences emphasized the importance of adaptability and responsive planning in educational programme development. Regular feedback from all stakeholders, coupled with agile management of resources, was key in addressing challenges and optimizing programme impact.

Feedback and Follow-up

To align the enhancement of out-of-classroom learning experiences with the seven learning goals of secondary education, the following targeted follow-up actions are proposed for the next school year:

1. Promote National and Global Identity:

- Action: Incorporate national and global themes and perspectives into external learning activities, such as local student interflows, mainland trips and overseas exchanges.
- Goal: Cultivate a sense of both national identity and global citizenship, as well as an appreciation for diverse cultures, enhancing students' understanding of their roles in these contexts.

2. Enhance Breadth of Knowledge:

- Action: Expand the range of out-of-classroom activities to include interdisciplinary learning experiences that cover a variety of subjects like science, arts, and humanities.
- Goal: Broaden students' knowledge base and expose them to a wide array of intellectual and cultural experiences.

3. Boost Language Proficiency:

- Action: Leverage language-rich activities such as debates, storytelling workshops, and language immersion trips to enhance language skills.
- o **Goal:** Improve both oral and written communication skills in multiple languages, fostering better expression and understanding.

4. Develop Generic Skills:

- Action: Design activities that require critical thinking, problem-solving, teamwork, and leadership, such as project-based learning and team competitions.
- Goal: Strengthen core academic and life skills that are essential for personal and professional success.

5. Advance Information Literacy:

- Action: Integrate information and technology skills into learning activities by embedding digital tools and resources across the curriculum.
- o **Goal:** Enhance students' abilities to effectively find, evaluate, and use information in a technologically driven world.

6. Support Life Planning:

- Action: Connect extra-curricular activities with career exploration opportunities, such as internships, job shadowing, and career talks by professionals.
- o **Goal:** Provide practical insights and experiences that help students make informed decisions about their future careers and life paths.

7. Encourage a Healthy Lifestyle:

- Action: Include physical activities and wellness programmes in the out-ofclassroom learning curriculum to promote physical health and mental wellbeing.
- o **Goal:** Instill a lifelong commitment to health and fitness, emphasizing the importance of a balanced lifestyle.

These actions are designed to ensure that the extension of learning beyond the classroom not only enriches students' academic experiences but also contributes holistically to their personal growth and development in alignment with the overarching educational objectives. This strategic approach will help students to integrate these valuable experiences into their everyday lives and future aspirations.

• Major concern 2: To cultivate in our students the core value of Catholic education with emphasis on "Love" and "Life"

Achievements

This year marked significant strides in embedding the core values of "Love" and "Life" as integral elements of the school's ethos, supported by the Catholic education framework. Key accomplishments include:

- Curriculum Integration: The school successfully integrated themes of "Love" and "Life" into the Values Education curriculum, impacting a substantial mass of student body. This impact is evidenced by the APASO results, which show that students achieved high scores in areas such as "Meaning in Life", "Honesty", and "Morality".
- Engagement in Values-based Activities: Through initiatives like the "My Class, My Family" scheme, students demonstrated enhanced mutual respect and empathy. Stakeholder Survey results showed a 95% approval rating for these programmes, reflecting their effectiveness in fostering a caring school environment.
- Community and Service Involvement: The Key Performance Measures (KPM) indicated an above-median participation rate in community service activities, which were aimed at practical applications of the values of "Love" and "Life". This aligns with the school's mission to extend these core values beyond the classroom into the wider community.

These achievements highlight the school's commitment to fostering an environment where Catholic values are not only taught but are vividly lived and experienced by the students.

Reflection

Facilitating Factors:

- Strong Leadership and Advocacy: The school's leadership played a pivotal role in championing these values through regular assemblies, workshops, and special events focused on Catholic teachings, which helped to maintain a high level of engagement and visibility of these core values.
- ◆ Collaborative Community Environment: The involvement of local parishes and community organizations provided real-world contexts for students to practice these values, enhancing their real-life application and understanding.

Hindering Factors:

- **Diverse Student Backgrounds:** The diverse backgrounds of students presented challenges in uniformly accepting and integrating these religious values, particularly among those of different faiths.
- Resource Constraints: Limitations in resources occasionally affected the breadth of programmes that could be offered, particularly in terms of staffing and material resources for expansive outreach programmes.

Consolidated Experience and Reflection: The experience this year underscored the importance of inclusivity and sensitivity in promoting religious values in a multicultural educational setting. The school learned to balance doctrinal teachings with a universal appeal to broader humanistic values, which facilitated wider acceptance and participation.

Feedback and Follow-up

Building upon the insights gained and the successes achieved, as well as to further align the cultivation of "Love" and "Life" with the seven learning goals of secondary education, the following follow-up measures are recommended to enhance the integration and impact of these core values in the school's curriculum and activities:

1. Promote National and Global Identity:

- Action: Integrate discussions of "Love" and "Life" within the contexts of national and global citizenship, encouraging students to consider how these values influence societal harmony and global peace.
- Goal: Foster a sense of responsibility and compassion towards different cultures and societies, enhancing students' understanding of their roles as national and global citizens.

2. Enhance Breadth of Knowledge:

- Action: Develop interdisciplinary modules that combine religious education with social sciences and natural sciences, illustrating the relevance of "Love" and "Life" across various fields.
- Goal: Provide a well-rounded education that demonstrates the applicability of core values in diverse contexts, thereby broadening students' academic and personal perspectives.

3. Boost Language Proficiency:

- Action: Utilize language classes to explore texts and materials that reflect themes of "Love" and "Life", encouraging expressive and reflective language use related to these values.
- Goal: Improve students' ability to articulate and debate moral and ethical issues in both their first and second languages, enhancing their communication skills.

4. Develop Generic Skills:

- Action: Incorporate problem-solving and collaborative projects focusing on real-world applications of "Love" and "Life," such as community service initiatives and collaborative workshops.
- o **Goal:** Strengthen students' critical thinking, collaboration, and problem-solving skills through value-driven contexts.

5. Advance Information Literacy:

- Action: Teach students to research and evaluate information on global issues and philosophical concepts related to "Love" and "Life", using technology and library resources.
- o **Goal:** Enhance students' abilities to access, analyze, and apply information, fostering informed decision-making and ethical reasoning.

6. Support Life Planning:

- Action: Integrate values education into career guidance and life planning curricula, discussing how "Love" and "Life" can guide personal and professional decisions.
- o **Goal:** Encourage students to consider their future roles and careers through the lens of their values, aiding in the development of a purposeful life plan.

7. Encourage a Healthy Lifestyle:

- Action: Promote activities that align with "Love" and "Life" in sports and health education, such as team sports and wellness programmes that emphasize teamwork, respect, and care for oneself and others.
- Goal: Cultivate a culture of health and well-being that is grounded in the appreciation of life and loving interactions, encouraging lifelong healthy habits.

These follow-up actions are designed to embed the core values of Catholic education deeply into all aspects of the school's educational framework, ensuring that students not only learn about "Love" and "Life" but also live these values in practical, meaningful ways across all dimensions of their educational experience.
