Other Programmes

Title:	Leadership Training of Student Guidance Service Group
Deliverables:	1. Big Brothers can develop their confidence by giving guidance to F.2 students, especially on studies 2. Big Brothers can enhance their leadership and counselling skills
Target:	25-30 F.4 to F.5 students
Selection mechanism:	Nominated by moderators
Duration and venue:	4 workshops and evaluation meetings from Sep 2024 to Mar 2025
Evaluation:	In view of the students' changing needs, some F.2 students were recruited as Big Brothers, which did not align with the ambit of the DLG. As such, the budget under the DLG was not used. Instead, the related expenses were covered by another grant, i.e., 校園・好精神一筆過津貼.
Expenditure:	NIL

Title:	History Elite Training Programme
Deliverables:	Students learn reading and high-order thinking skills through sharing and discussion sessions, as well as writing reflective essays.
Target:	F.4-F.5 History students
Selection mechanism:	Nominated by the History panel
Duration and venue:	One bookshop visit (attendance: 92.9%) and two sharing sessions (attendance: 78.6%) were held from April to July 2025
Evaluation:	- 14 F.4-F.5 Students from the History class enjoyed doing research based on the selected books and worked well in groups. Comprehensive learning skills could be enhanced by completing the presentations with groupmates. - Due to limited time (before the final exam) to complete the programme, students forming five groups could only complete their presentations. The original plan of writing reflective essays was not achieved.
Expenditure:	\$1642.75

Title:	Mathematics School Team Training
Deliverables:	Students learn Mathematics problem solving skills and apply them in Mathematics competitions.
Target:	About 4 selected school team members from each form (F.4-6)
Selection mechanism:	Nominated by Mathematics teachers
Duration and venue:	Training was held once or twice before each competition after school from Oct 2024 to May 2025 and each lesson lasted for about 1.5 hours
Evaluation:	The training was mainly for F.4-6 students. However some important junior form maths competitions were held and training was also arranged for them. This year, junior form students got very good prizes while senior form students did not get many. One of the reasons is that most the competitions were arranged on Saturday and senior form students had make-up lessons on Saturday. Some of the results are as follows : One 1st Honour Class award and two 3rd Honour Class award in the Hong Kong Youth Mathematical High Achievers Selection Contest. One 3rd Class Honour award in the 42nd Hong Kong Mathematics Olympiad The training class will continue next year and hope that the students can get better results.

Target:	5-10 F.4-F.5 students
Selection mechanism:	Nominated by teachers
Duration and venue:	Lessons throughout the year
Evaluation:	➤ 2 F.5 students completed the 香港 200 領袖計劃 ➤ 1 F.6 student completed the Youth to Sustainability Summit 2025. ➤ 1 F.4 student obtained an A in HKUST Dual Program_Physics Level 1.
Expenditure:	\$6780

Title:	Subsidy for one F.5 student and two F.6 students to attend DSE PE lessons
Deliverables:	The student could acquire the knowledge and exam skills
Target:	1 F.5 student and 2 F.6 students
Selection mechanism:	Nominated by teachers
Duration and venue:	1. 3 hours every Saturday in the first term and the second term 2. Attend lessons in Lai King
Evaluation:	Both students attended about all sessions and his attendance was above 95%. Their results are extremely good in the course. They would also help to organize some trainings for the schoolmates throughout the year.
Expenditure:	\$ 24000

Title:	Employing a TA for Gifted Education
Deliverables:	Helping the English Panel provide learning materials for F.4-6 students
Target:	All F.4-6 students
Selection mechanism:	All F.4 to F.6 students are beneficiaries The recruitment process follows the normal process of open recruitment
Duration and venue:	June- August 2025
Evaluation:	The English TA helped the panel with the SBA, extra lessons and preparing learning materials for senior form students
Expenditure:	\$ 48557.25
